GLOUCESTERSHIRE AAA COUNTY ROAD RUNNING AWARDS 2007

This week has seen Bourton members receive so many awards, they'll be building more shelves to accommodate them! Firstly at the prestigious County Awards Ceremony at the Council Chambers in Gloucester, presented by the Mayor of Gloucester, 13 of the individual awards and all the team awards were taken home by Bourton runners.

Firstly, leading from the very top and for an unprecedented 17th time, Dennis Walmsley clearly won the Senior Men and Vet/40 categories. Alistair Lockey, just behind mirrored the achievement with 2nd Senior Man and 2nd V/40. Tony Goodwill had an excellent year culminating in 1st V/50, as did John Raper, winning gold this year in the V/55 and giving him a full set of medals after his previous years' silver and bronze.In a very competitive age group Norm Lane was delighted to receive 2nd place, while Dennis Abbotts walked away with 1st V/65.

The ladies also achieved considerable success, with Ali Lane finishing 2nd in the Senior Ladies and 1st LV/45. Kate Hall retained the LV/35 trophy for the third year running, Shirley Creed finished 3rd LV/40 and Lynn Hudson finished 3rd LV50.




Christmas Dinner

RACE RESULTS - NOV/DEC

Schools Inter-County X/C – Friday 16th Nov

Bourton's juniors all excelled in their respective races in the first stage of the Schools X/C at St. Edwards in Cheltenham on Friday 16th November. Keiren Shoemark had an excellent 2nd in the Under 11 Boys. Beth Pudifoot also finished 2nd with a brilliant run, supported superbly by Beth Wynn. Brittany Teague had a clear win in the Inter Girls, while Steph Lane finished 2nd in the Seniors. Tom Jess achieved his best position to date in the Schools of 4th in the Senior Boys.

Leamington X/C – Saturday 17th Nov

A depleted adult field turned out for the 2nd Gloucestershire X/C league race at Leamington Spa on Saturday 17th November, as some of the top runners were competing the next day in the Wimborne 10M Race.

Tony Goodwill was first home for the club in 62nd place and 45.59, followed by Norm Lane 121st 52.27, Brian Hulcup 128th 53.15 and Bert Jess 161st 1.02.38.

The Ladies race had Ali Lane in 24th place 35.52, Liz Hulcup, who did brilliantly considering she had a bad fall during the race incurring a fractured wrist, in 49th place 39.20 and Pauline Teague 52nd and 39.53.

Brittany Teague had an excellent 3rd in the Under 17s, especially after racing the day before at St. Edwards, as did Tom Jess in the U/17 Boys, finishing 9th on this occasion.

Keiren Shoemark had a good solid 14th spot in 14.40 in the Under 13 Boys, while the only junior team from the club, the under 11 Boys, Elliot Lockey, 19th, Ben Darwent 22nd and Alex Darwent 30th worked together superbly.

Wimborne Inter-Counties 10M Race –Sun 18th Nov

10 members of the County travelled to Wimborne, proud to represent Gloucestershire in the Inter-Counties South West 10 Mile Championship Race, selected by Norm Lane, County Road Race Manager and their loyalty was well rewarded with every team member coming home with a medal.

In terrible conditions with pouring rain and on a very hilly course, the ladies excelled, led home with a very strong and committed run by Helen Fines in 2nd place and a fantastic time of 1hr, 1 min and 9 secs., even more remarkable after her 3rd placing in the Gloucestershire X/C league the previous day. The 'Severn' girls packed together with Lucie Woodyatt pulling a personal best out of the bag to just pip team mate Jo Fletcher with superb times of 1.04.23 and 1.04.42 in 5th and 6th place. Nicola Denning, of Cirencester, also selected for her first County Vest, consolidated the team to take Gold in 18th place and another personal best time of 1.07.33. Norm Lane was thrilled to bring the winning cup home to Glos. for the first time.

The men also performed superbly with Bourton veteran, Dennis Walmsley, leading them home in 8th place, 1st M/40 and a time taking him to 5th place in the Vet 45 British Rankings, of 55.15. He was pushed to his limit again by club mates Alistair Lockey, who lifted the 3rd Vet 40 prize and Mike Smith, re-emerging after months of injury, who finished 14th 56.36 and 17th 57.08 respectively. Cirencester's Bill Leggate, 21st, with a big personal best of 58.23 headed Cheltenham's experienced runner, Andy McCoy, who was delighted with 31st place in 59.45 and latecomer to the team, Rob Edwards of Bourton, rounded off a very solid team performance with 1.07. The County squad secured a very safe bronze place, all taking home medals, just as a very enthusiastic Lane had predicted in his pre-race talk. Lane supported his teams round the course in the driving rain with no sign of an umbrella and was a very proud manager at the end of the day!

Eynsham 10k – 25th Nov

Near perfect conditions favoured the Eynsham 10K on Sunday, 25th November, where as usual they had maximum capacity and entries closed long before the race date. Although not part of the usual Club Series, it still attracted a good number of Bourton Roadrunners, out to get a good time near the end of the year's racing.

Dennis Walmsley ran particularly well, just losing out to Chris Illman of Cirencester after a closely fought battle throughout, finishing 4th overall and 2nd V/40 in a time of 33.21. Alistair Lockey also did well for 34.08, while Andy Chapple achieved a personal best of 37.29. Rob Edwards, returning from injury, was delighted to record 39.23.

Steph Lane was the first of the Bourton ladies to finish, knocking over a minute off her previous best 10K time to record 41.16, well ahead of mum, Ali who received 2nd Vet/45 in 43.05 and dad, Norm in 43.23.

Jimmy Lunney had a good run in 43.37 and Rob Humphris, who had been with the afore mentioned 2 runners until the latter stages, just dropped off at the end, recording 44.19. Brian Hulcup suffered a leg problem mid race, but managed to finish well in 45.28.

A constant change of positions between Robin Macdonald, Lynn Hudson, Liz Hulcup and Sarah Clemo occurred throughout the race, but they finished in the order reported, with respective times of 48.31, 48.34, 48.36 and 48.47.

A welcome rare appearance of Jo Pritchard saw her finish in 51.13 and Bert Jess 51.48.

Schools County Champs - 8th Dec

The junior members did the Club proud running in the Schools County Champs at Blackbridge in Gloucester on Saturday, with Kieren Shoemark finishing 11th in the Minor Boys, Tom Jess, with a supreme effort, 7th in the Senior Boys, Brittany Teague 2nd in the Inter Girls, Beth Pudifoot 5th in the Junior Girls and Steph Lane 2nd in the Senior

Girls.

All of them qualified to represent Gloucestershire Schools at the Inter Counties Championships at Bute Park in Cardiff on the 20th January.

Wootton ½ marathon – 9th Dec

Four of the older members bravely decided to participate in the Wootton half marathon in Bedford the morning after the Club Dinner! However performances were not impaired, despite the tough undulating course and winds and rain, with Mike Smith finishing 13th in 1.15.52, John Gibson 1.49.47, Eddie Rozier 1.51.10 and Roger Woodley 1.51.15.

Cross-Country Handicap 5m race – 22nd **Dec**

A good fun blast before Christmas came in the form of the Plock Court X/C Handicap 5M race, where competitors are "roughly" handicapped according to their recent race times, therefore the first person in might not necessarily have the fastest time.

First in for Bourton Roadrunners was Mike Smith in a very well placed 6th, coming through well despite his harsh time handicap with a personal time of 26.42. Luke Gray took first under 20 prize with a fine sprint finish for 32.48. Steph Lane finished 9th overall and 1st lady in an excellent time of 33.12. With such a fierce handicap, Tom Jess did well to be next finisher and first under 18 in 31.23; closely chased by Tony Goodwill 31.05. Ali Lane finished 3rd lady and 1st V45 in 34.51, with Lynn Hudson 39.35 and Bert Jess 42.03.

X/C Blackbridge – 15th Dec

Sarah Clemo added valuable support to the Ladies Vet Team in the 3rd Race of the Gloucestershire X/C Series, which again was held at Blackbridge in Gloucester, finishing an excellent 39th in 33.24, just one place behind team mate, Pauline Teague 33.08. Ali Lane finished 20th in 29.36, giving them 3rd team in the Lady Vets' section.

Dennis Walmsley had a strong run in the Men's race, gaining places in the 3rd lap to finish in 8th place 33.03, just 6 seconds behind Mark Fallows of Cirencester. Andy Chappell and Ben Coles also performed well in 50th 37.08 and 60th 37.53 respectively. Norm Lane battled through for 3rd Vet 60, with a placing of 110th in 42.22 and Chris Bence, 142nd, completed the Vet Team in 47.38. The Vet team finished 9th overall.

Other results were: U/11 Boys Ben and Alex Darwent, 20th and 27th, U/15 Girls Beth Wynn 17th, U/17 Girls Brittany Teague 3rd and U/17 Boys Tom Jess 13th.

Elwood 5 M MT -16th Dec

Mike Smith, in intensive training for his Mumbai Marathon in January, is returning to his form of earlier this year and racing most weekends. On Sunday he led from start to finish in the Elwood 5 Mile Multi-Terrain in the Forest of Dean, winning 36 seconds ahead of his nearest rival, Mark Harvey of Chepstow and recording a time of 29.13.

Gloucester 10M – (County & 6/10) -6th Jan



Mike Smith shows his training is coming to fruition for the Mumbai Marathon on 20th January in India, with his conclusive win in the Gloucester 10 Mile race on Sunday, where he left his fellow competitors trailing in his wake from 5 miles onwards. His confidence must surely be boosted by the strong run, with the winning time of 54.11.

Dennis Walmsley, in 3rd place with a time of 55.49 also looked good, finishing first V45 in the first of the Gloucestershire Road Race Series.

Andy Chapple had an excellent run in 1.03.28 while Tony Goodwill and Rob Edwards battled together until the closing stages, where Goodwill pulled away to a time of 1.05.27 to Edwards' 1.05.44.

Ben Coles ran well after racing the day before in the County X/C Champs with a time of 1.06.48.

Other results were Ian Shoemark 1.07.45, Neil Teague 1.09.25, Nigel Frith 1.12.57, Norm Lane, 2nd V/60 after running X/C the day before, 1.15.02, Rob Humphris 1.15.02, Ed Rozier 1.23.32 and Dennis Abbotts 1.29.08.
