xpectations were high for the Bourton
Highbridge Jewellers 10k, with this year's
570 places selling out quicker than tickets
for Take That.

Those determined enough to secure a place (staying up until midnight or setting an early alarm) included 81 Almost Athletes, 35 CLC Striders, 25 Tewkesbury ACs, 11 Bourton Roadrunners and a whole hoard of Holton family-members.

The participating Bourton runners had the added challenge of persuading a friend or family member to 'marshal' (i.e. stand out in the freezing February cold for the best part of 2 hours).

Race direction was once again in the cool, calm hands of Ian Shoemark, with the support of many of the clubs' 'old faithfuls'.

Happily, the 'uncontrollables' were on our side the early morning ice had largely disappeared by the time the race hit the road and the forecasted hail and high winds held off until the last runner was home.

The race was won by Will Ferguson from CLC Striders in 32:36, with Anthony Bailey (Cheltenham and County Harriers) second in 33:06 and Stephen Price (Uknetrunner) third in 33.24.

The Ladies race seemed to be dominated by people called Kate. First lady was Rachel Felton (34.17), followed by Kate Hulls (Bristol and West

AC) in 35:37 and Sophie Carter (Belgrave Harriers) in 36.20. (Stratford AC's Kate Wright was 5th and Swindon's Kate Jacobs was 6th).

First home for Bourton Roadrunners was the always-impressive Chris Krzywiec in 36:16, with Tim Heming finishing in a superb 37:19. Speedy Shona Crombie-Hicks was 1st FV40 (37:43) with Lucy Walmsley reaping the benefits of marathon-training with 38:47. New boy on the block Ross Kent made a fantastic race debut for the club, with 39:18.

There were personal best performances from Niamh Shoemark (running with enviable calmness and clocking a superb 41:22), Claire Harrison (making coach Doug proud in 42:43) and Susan Hunt (delighted but wishing she'd found an extra second with 45:00). Steph Holton ran within 2 seconds of her previous best in 45:31; and importantly beat all the other members of her family. Maxine Emes ran a strong 51:01 and Alan Gibson a fine 51:41. Shona, Lucy and Niamh were 2nd Ladies' team behind Almost Athletes.

No doubt, during the race preparation and planning there were unseen challenges and dramas; but what we witnessed on the day was a professionally-executed race with a fantastic, happy atmosphere. Congratulations to Ian and all those who helped to put on another race of which we could all be proud.

# December 2014 round-up

Bourton Roadrunners had a rest from club competition races during December; although many members continued to race, finishing the year with some fantastic performances

Claire Harrison completed 2 marathons in 2 consecutive days at the Engima Christmas Double. Her amazing 3:45 on Day 1 and 3:41 on Day 2 won her the First Lady title for her debut double.

Steve Edwards was first overall (3:14 Day 1 and 3:21 Day 2) and was delighted to finish the year with a landmark 500th sub 3:25.

Meanwhile, Steph Holton and Catherine Wheeler opted for the Andy Reading Memorial 10k at Bicester. Steph finished in her fastest time of the year, 46:14 (2nd Vet 45) and Catherine Wheeler also had a great run, with a PB of 46:32.

Steve Edwards welcomed in the New Year by completing another double (his 667th & 668th marathons) at Folkestone – recording 3:31 & 3:23 in an event that he described as "one of the toughest doubles I've done in a very long time due to weather conditions. Extremely strong headwind for half the course. especially on day 1 where it felt like you were running on the spot!"

Stratford AC's Not the Roman IX provided the first opportunity of 2015 to test the speed in the legs on a 12k loop from Tiddington via Loxley.

Nigel Frith was first home for Bourton in 52:43 followed by Claire Harrison (54:15), Susan Hunt (56:01) and Brian Hulcup (59:46). Liz Hulcup was 2nd LV60 (1:02:59) with Lynn Hudson 1:08:36.

## 25 January 2015

The Linda Franks 5 mile race, organised by Almost Athletes was the first race in the 2015 GAA Road Race series.

Darren Long was first home for Bourton (13th overall 30:34), with Shona Crombie-Hicks close behind (1st Lady 31:00). Two team members making a return to racing following injury were Ewen Smith (33:15), and Steph Lane who had an excellent run for 33:39 3rd Senior Lady. Niamh Shoemark was 3rd LV45 with 34:02 and Claire Harrison 1st LV35 (34:53). Next came Catherine

# **Round 3 Pittville Park 3 January**

Bourton Roadrunner Juniors again turned out in numbers to compete in the third round of the Gloucestershire Cross Country League Competition at Pittville Park in Cheltenham.

In the **U11 girls** Helena West and Isobel Barnett pushed each other hard for 7th and 8th with both girls battling for 1st and 2nd place in the club competition. Celia Darwent ran her best race to date with an excellent 24th place. These results placed the A team in 4th place on the day and still in 2nd place overall. These girls were well supported by Annabella Tallis (27th), Isabelle Morriss (33rd), Abigail Barnett (38th), Isabel Dennett (40th), Ella Lane-Gregory (51st) and Erika Creed (52nd). These girls helped the B team to 9th and the C team to 13th on the day.

Lucy Griffin 2nd, Bethan Powell 3rd and Josephine Mutsaars 7th kept the **U13 girls** team in overall 1st position although they came 2nd to Stroud on the day. Lucy was again pushed hard by Bethan and Josephine ran her best race of the season.
